

Data Transfer



You cannot use your stock recorder until you have sent your farm details from FarmWorks on the computer to your stock recorder.

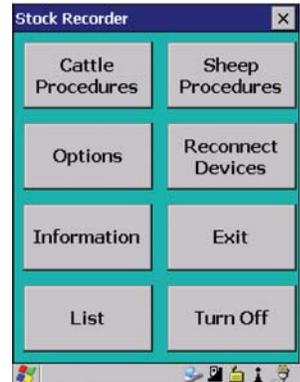
Data Transfer - Send data to the stock recorder

- » Place the stock recorder firmly in the cradle, with the power and USB leads connected. The stock recorder desktop must be visible, with FarmWorks closed.

Stock recorder desktop - FarmWorks closed



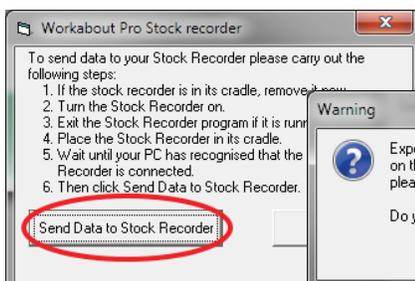
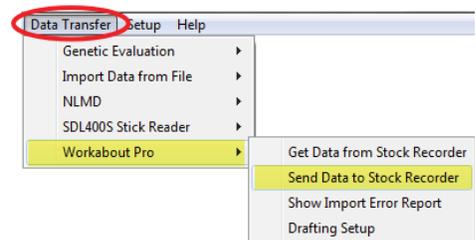
Stock recorder desktop - FarmWorks open



- » Open Windows Mobile Device Center on your computer. (Look for a green circle icon or use the search function. See the stock recorder installation guide for more help with this program.)
- » Look for the green tick to show the stock recorder is connected.



- » Open FarmWorks on your computer.
- » Go to **Data Transfer > Workabout Pro > Send Data to Stock Recorder**.
- » Click on **Send Data to Stock Recorder**
- » Note the warning message but carry on if this is the first time you are transferring data - click **OK**.
- » If your data was successfully transferred then your stock recorder is ready to use.

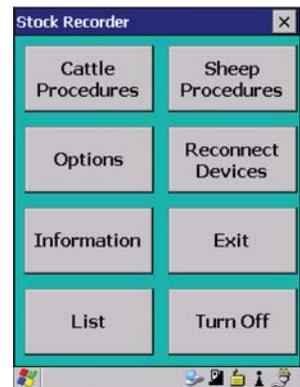
Data Transfer - Send data to the stock recorder

FarmWorks closed



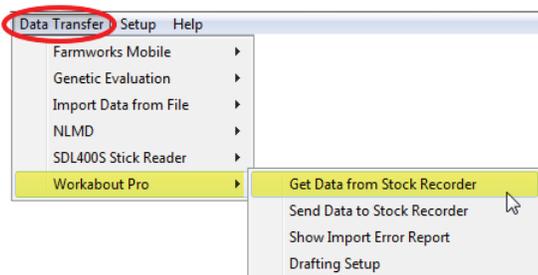
Stock recorder desktop -

- » Open Windows Mobile Device Center on your computer. (Look for a green circle icon or use the search function. See the Psion stock recorder installation guide for more help with this program.)
- » Look for the green tick to show the stock recorder is connected.



- » Open FarmWorks on your computer.
- » Go to **Data Transfer > Workabout Pro > Get Data from Stock Recorder**.
- » Click on **Get Data from Stock Recorder**.



- » If there are any warning messages you have the option to read them now, or you can look at them later through the Data Transfer > Workabout Pro menu. These warning messages are there for a reason - read and act on them if necessary, before you use the stock recorder again!
